Recently, after getting the entire family in the van on our way toward Ohio to visit family, we were just a few minutes away when we realized that we had forgotten something we needed. We essentially had two options. The first option was to keep going and go on without it. The second option, which we opted for, was to turn around and return home to get it. With 4 little kids, you can probably imagine, this is a constant dilemma in our lives, do we keep going or do we return to get what we need?

The season of Lent is a time of repentance. It's an annual reminder that we need Jesus in our lives to navigate this often dark and difficult world. It's a spiritual season where we are faced with this same question: Do we keep going on about our lives, knowing that we have left something behind? Or do we return home to get the thing we know we need and are supposed to have?

I have always understood repentance as just saying sorry for our sins. However, recently that view has been challenged by author and speaker Allen Hirsch. He notes, "Repentance is the first word Jesus uses to invite people into the kingdom. It's more than sorry, it's a reorientation of our lives toward God." The call to repentance is a challenge to return our lives to Jesus. It's a challenge to reorient our entire being around the risen Lord. As we walk this spiritual journey toward Resurrection Sunday, may we return home to Jesus.

Sermon Series Abraham: Into the Unknown Continued

March 3rd

Title- "When God Takes Too Long" Focus Passage- Genesis 16:1-16

Secondary Passage- James 1:3-4

Synopsis- Sarah can no longer wait for God's promise, and can we blame her? She's of old age. She's barren. None of it makes sense to her. She has Abraham take matters into his own hands and he gets a servant girl pregnant. This is Abraham's son, but he's not the promise. The Lord, in his grace will care for this child and mother, but the sto- lamb. This is our story of redemption. God provides ry isn't over and Abraham's lack of faith will cause reverberations throughout the generations to follow. What do we do when God takes too long?

March 10th

Title- "The Sign of the Covenant"

Focus Passage- Genesis 17:12-21

Secondary Passage - 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

Synopsis- God directs Abraham in the sign of the covenant, a symbol that the Hebrew people have been marked by God. Abraham still hasn't received the promised son, but he has received the promise of the covenant. God makes a binding contract with Abraham and with us. In communion, we join in the new covenant sealed in the blood of Christ. Even in the unknown, we have the assurance of the promise.

March 17th

Title- "A Faithful God"

Focus Passage- Genesis 21:1-13

Secondary Passage - 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24 Synopsis- Finally, after years of waiting, the Lord delivers his promise to Abraham and Sarah gives birth to a son named Isaac. This doesn't solve any of Abraham's problems, it actually creates more for him. However, the Lord was faithful, even when Abraham was not. Do we trust in the faithfulness of God?

March 24th- Palm Sunday

Title- "Where is the Lamb?"

Focus Passage- Genesis 22:1-14

Secondary Passage- John 12:12-19

Synopsis- Abraham was given the impossible and now he is asked to give it up. It seems like a cruel joke. However, Abraham knows that all things belong to God. Isaac asks a question that should ring deep in our souls as we prepare for Easter: "Where is the lamb for the sacrifice?" The Lord provides the the lamb, his Son, who will go to the cross for us.

March 28th- Maundy Thursday

Title- "At the Foot of the Cross"

Focus Passage – Mark 15:33-39

Synopsis- One of the most remarkable moments of the crucifixion is the centurion at the foot of the cross. He was a Roman solider, physically responsible for the death of Jesus. Yet, as he watches everything unfold, he makes a bold proclamation, "Truly this was the Son of God." There's no resurrection. Nothing miraculous has happened, yet the Holy Spirit opened his heart at the foot of the cross.

March 31st- Easter

Title- "Because He Lives"

Focus Passage- 1 Corinthians 15:12-26

Secondary Passage- Job 19:25-27

Synopsis- The resurrection of Jesus changes everything. No one person has more of an impact on the course of human history than Jesus and those who follow him. The old hymn says, "Because he lives I can face tomorrow, because he lives all fear is gone." Because Jesus lives we can live with joy, hope, and love.




