After the disciples receive the Holy Spirit they go out and preach the gospel. They experience rapid growth as 3,000 were added to their number that day. This is the birth of the Church and Acts tells us that there were 6 key things the early church devoted themselves to. These are the pillars on which the church was built and to be the church today, we must continue to build on them. This series will focus on Acts 2:42-47 as we continue to build on the pillars of faith.



#### <u>April 7th</u>

#### Title- "Resurrection means Revelation!"

Focus Passage– Luke 24:36-49 Secondary Passage– Isaiah 29:18-19 The disciples are living in fear, and confusion after the resurrection. The death and now resurrection has left them first in pain then in jubilation. Who was this man that they had been following all these years? Now they face a whole new life. A life as witnesses. A life of service, a new confidence in Christ.

#### <u>April 14<sup>th</sup></u>

#### Title – "The Apostle's Teaching"

Focus Passage – Hebrews 4:12-13 Secondary Passage – Isaiah 40:6-8 Synopsis – "They devoted themselves to the apostle's teaching," is the first pillar of the early church. The teaching of the Apostle's are actually the things that Jesus commanded them to teach in the great commission. They are committing themselves to the very Word of God, both the Old Testament and what will become the New Testament. To be a healthy church we must be committed to the teachings of Jesus.

#### <u>April 21<sup>st</sup></u> Title – "Fellowship"

Focus Passage – 1 John 1:1-10 Secondary Passage – Proverbs 27:17 Synopsis – The early church committed themselves to fellowship and the breaking of bread. This doesn't just mean they were nice to their neighbors. They built community together around a unifying creed, that Jesus is Lord. The gospel calls us to fellowship, not only with each other, but with God. We need community if we're going to live on mission for the kingdom.

#### April 28<sup>th</sup>

Title – "Prayer"

Focus Passage – Matthew 6:5-15 Secondary Passage – 2 Chronicles 7:14 Synopsis – In Acts 2 we learn that these disciples committed themselves to prayer. Prayer can sometimes be a hard spiritual discipline to follow and many of us don't know how to pray. Jesus gives us a clear understanding of how we are to approach God. If we're going to be a healthy church in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, we need to pray.

### **Pastor Steve's Sabbatical**

At November's congregational meeting the session announced that it had approved a time of sabbatical for Pastor Steve. We know there are many questions surrounding this issue and over the next few months we will attempt to answer them through the newsletter, a frequently asked questions page, and congregational announcements during worship.

The session appointed a sabbatical team in the fall of 2023 to help with the planning, budgeting, and approval of coverage for Steve's absence. We are the members of that team: Peg Morrison, Mark Jordan, and Don Smith. If you have any questions or concerns about the process or plan, please do not hesitate to contact us.

The word sabbatical derives from the Hebrew word, sabbath. To clarify a few things, in view of what a sabbatical is, the church is not funding a vacation for Steve and his family. The purpose is for our pastor to care for his soul in order to be renewed, restored, and refreshed to better serve the kingdom and our congregation to the fullest. The focus of Steve's time away will be spiritual renewal. He will spend a week with his mentor and a spiritual advisor, a week retreating with other pastors, and a week building up his marriage on a faith-based marriage retreat.


