

He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he restores my soul. – Psalm 23

In the summer of 2022, as the COVID pandemic was winding down and we were starting to return to normal in our church, two elders approached me with sincere concern. They were worried about me and the potential for burn out. I had two thoughts. The first was how awesome it is to be a part of a church whose elders take their role seriously. They showed deep care for me and my soul, something I have become accustomed to in this congregation and I am incredibly grateful for. The second thought, which I voiced to them, was that I'm great. The church was flourishing. We're growing. Everything was going so well, and they had no reason to worry.

Looking back, those elders were full of wisdom and clearly had followed the prompting of the Holy Spirit. Not long after that conversation I began to crash. As church life was returning to normal, and the adrenaline of the season started to wear off, I started to feel like my soul had just finished a marathon. As I shared this with multiple mentors and friends, in early 2023, each came back with the same answer, "Steve, after all these years it's about time for you to take a sabbatical. If you're going to keep thriving in ministry, you need to rest."

Over the last 18 months the session and I have been planning and working toward a sabbatical. Psalm 23 seems like the perfect text to explain what will be happening during my time away, at least it's what we hope for. It feels like Jesus is making me lie down and take a rest. This goes against my nature, but I know it is what I now need in order to fulfill my role as your pastor. Over my three months away I plan to walk with Jesus, to dwell with him, so that He can restore my soul. I'm grateful for an amazing session of elders who have granted me and my family this gift. I'm grateful for a wonderful church that has cared for us so well. I promise this sabbatical has one purpose, which will be the theme for the entire church, "He Restores My Soul." I pray that I will return to you renewed, restored, and reenergized for the ministry of the kingdom that is happening at Meridian. I hope you will join me in that prayer.

## <u>Pillars: What the Church is Built On</u> (Continued)

#### May 5th

Title- "Generosity"

Focus Passage— Matthew 6:19-24
Secondary Passage— Proverbs 11:24-25
Synopsis— One of the marks of the church, a pillar from the very beginning, was the generosity that flowed through the followers of Jesus. They sold their property and possessions, gave to anyone who had need, and they shared everything in common. In our consumeristic culture, the generous life has the potential to be a great witness to the kingdom of God. As Jesus teaches us, where your treasure is there your heart will be.

#### May 12th

Title- "Worshiping"

Focus Passage—1 Chronicles 16:23-34
Secondary Passage—Romans 12:1-2
Synopsis—Worship is at the heart of faith and a pillar of the church. Our Christian culture today convinces us that worship is about you, your preferences, and your growth. However, worship is not about what you get, it is about what you give. It's how you come before God in adoration and praise for who he is. Worship is not what you experience, rather it is what you offer.

#### May 19th

Title- "Mission"

Focus Passage— Matthew 28:16-20 Secondary Passage— Isaiah 60:1-3 Synopsis— When we build the church on these pillars, mission is the only possible outcome. As the disciples and the early church lived out these values "the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved." Mission is not a committee or program, but the outcome of a life lived in Christ

that is committed to the apostles teaching, community, generosity, and worship. Mission is not something you do, it is who we are.

## New Sermon Series

### Philemon: Forged in Forgiveness

His name means affectionate in Greek. He was a slave owner in the city of Colossae and had been converted to faith by Paul. From prison Paul writes a letter to his brother and friend. Onesimus is a runaway slave, who also comes to faith in Rome. He belonged to Philemon and Paul tells him to go back with this letter. We learn that they are no longer slave and free, but brothers in Christ. We often need these gentle reminders of grace in our lives.

#### May 26th

Title- "On the Basis of Love"

Focus Passage—Philemon 1:1-11
Secondary Passage—Nehemiah 9:16-18
Synopsis—Philemon is Paul's friend and brother in Christ. As his slave returns, Paul appeals to him on the basis of love, and not the law, to let Onesimus walk free. Our partnership in the gospel is not rooted in the law, but on the basis of love. When we love our neighbor as ourselves, we cannot help but extend grace. It's how we are forged in forgiveness.



## Sabbatical Team Update

As we announced last month, Pastor Steve and the session are preparing for a sabbatical from July 1<sup>st</sup> through September 30<sup>th</sup>. We know there are many questions and as we promised, we will be using the newsletter and announcements in worship to explain the details of our plans.

One of the most asked questions so far is how much this will cost and what exactly will the church be covering for Pastor Steve? First, the church will not be covering any personal vacations or expenses for Steve during the sabbatical. Second, we believe the sabbatical should be a time of rest and renewal for Steve. We have agreed to cover any professional and spiritual enrichment plans for the three-month period.

As many of you know, Pastor Steve already has a professional reimbursement account specifically for continuing education and professional development. According to the original terms of call from 2010, unused money in that account accumulates up to \$3,600. We have rolled that money over through the years. Due to grants and financial diligence, the total cost to the church for Pastor Steve's four spiritual and professional development opportunities is estimated to cost about \$4,200. With the rolled over account and this year's professional reimbursement account already budgeted, the sabbatical will not cost the church any extra funds outside of already budgeted expenses.

The session has set aside some extra funds for the staff who will be picking up some of the slack while Pastor Steve is away as a way to thank them for their work. We already have a pulpit supply budget line and will be using all of that for some of the guest preachers who will visit us during the sabbatical period. At this point, we are projecting minimal extra expenses for the church during this time.

Finally, Pastor Steve had accumulated rolled over study leave over the last several years. He will be using four weeks of study leave time and two weeks of his vacation time for the sabbatical. This means the session is granting a six-week sabbatical on top of Pastor Steve's use of his personal study leave and vacation time.
