It's been a difficult and dark few weeks in our country. The truth is we have just taken notice of the darkness that is always present. As Americans we like to believe that these things are not supposed to happen in our culture. We want to believe that we're better than this and our values of freedom are upheld by all people. Whether it's the school shooting of the kids starting the year with Catholic mass or the assassination of Charlie Kirk, we know deep down there is something wrong. We know the world is not as it should be.

In these moments the natural human instinct is to get revenge, fight back, or take a stand. While I understand that impulse, the call of Christ requires something entirely different. I was struck by the words of Kirk's widow, Erika, as she called on us to forgive this young man who took the life of her husband. It's incredible in the sense that it goes against every instinct we have. She should be angry, bitter, and after justice. Instead, she called for forgiveness. That's a distinctive marker of the Christian life and the exact calling that each of us carry.

CS Lewis once wrote, "If a thing is free to be good it is also free to be bad. And free will is what has made evil possible. Why, then, did God give them free will? Because free will, though it makes evil possible, is also the only thing that makes possible any love or goodness or joy worth having." Evil is part of this world. Our response is not anger or rage, but love. In a world on the brink of madness, we must not compromise the command of Christ to respond with radical grace and radical love.

Sermon Series: Jesus is Greater continued

A study on the book of Hebrews

Hebrews is one of the most challenging, but beautifully crafted books in the Bible.
This book is filled with deep theology, mixed with practical understanding of who Jesus really is. As we dive deep into this letter we will find a powerful message for today's church, one that is simple: Jesus is greater.

October 5th—World Communion Sunday Title- "Entering His Rest"

Focus Passage— Hebrews 4:1-13
Secondary Passage— Exodus 20:8-11
Synopsis— Rest is part of the ordered human life, it's what God has made us for. We've lost the art of Sabbath. However, the holy life still requests rest. The Word of God is living and active, it cuts to the heart. Let us make every effort to enter his rest.

October 12th

Title- "Our Great High Priest"

Focus Passage— Hebrews 4:145:10
Secondary Passage— Leviticus 21:6-8
Synopsis— The priest stood between God and man. They offered a representation of humanity to the Lord along with the sacrifices necessary for atonement. In Jesus we have the great high priest, the one who fulfills it all on our behalf. Through him we have confidence to approach the throne of grace.

October 19th

Title- "An Anchor for the Soul"

Focus Passage— Hebrews 6:13-20 Secondary Passage— Hebrews 5:11-6:12 Synopsis— Two things that are important in the Christian life are maturity and perseverance. The modern church and American culture suffers greatly in both areas. Often in our spirituality we're still drinking milk, when we should be eating solid food. Instead we should flee to take hold of the hope set before, which we have as an anchor for the soul.

October 26th

Title- ""Our Eternal Priest"

Focus Passage— Hebrews 7:11-28
Secondary Passage— Genesis 14:17-20
Synopsis— Who is Melchizedek and why does he matter? He was a priest and a king, one whom Abraham gave a tenth of everything as a tithe in Genesis. He was a priest before the line of Levi. It wasn't because of his blood line, but his anointing. Jesus isn't our eternal priest because he's from the priestly order, but because God has anointed him to take up our sin so the sacrifice is no longer necessary.




