November 2nd

Title- "A Greater Promise"

Focus Passage- Hebrews 8:1-13

Secondary Passage – Jeremiah 31:31-34

Synopsis—Some theologians argue that the old covenant is one of law. The law is given through the grace of God, and therefore, must be a covenant of grace. The law points us forward to the greater promise that is to come, Jesus Christ. The law is a place holder until the Great High Priest take his rightful place. The law is only a shadow of the good things.

November 9th

Title- "Once and For All"

Focus Passage- Hebrews 9:15-28

Secondary Passage-Hebrews 9:1-14

Synopsis-Under the old covenant there was a process of sacrifice for the atonement of sins. Under the new covenant the sacrifice has been made once and for all. The blood of Jesus secures

our eternal redemption.

November 16th

Title- "By Faith"

Focus Passage – Hebrews 11:1-13

Secondary Passage—Isaiah 40:28-31

Synopsis— Faith is closely linked to hope. Faith is looking at God and trusting him for everything. Hebrews defines exactly what faith means, the assurance of things hoped for. It's in this hope and by this faith that the saints who have gone before us have walked, and it's by faith that we too must walk.

November 23rd

Title- "Run the Race"

Focus Passage - Hebrews 12:1-7

Secondary Passage – Proverbs 28:13

Synopsis— If we walk by faith then we can run the race with perseverance. How we run that race is not by the strength of our will, but by fixing our eyes on Jesus. It's easy to lose heart along the journey. In order to finish we must consider him who bore the cross for us.

Advent: Expecting Joy

Advent is a season of waiting, longing, and expecting what is to come. We sometimes confuse this season of expectations as passively hoping God will show up. There is nothing passive about the Christian life. While we wait in the darkness, we're filled with expectant joy, knowing the one we are waiting for is going to make all things new.

November 30th

Title- "Joy in the Promise"

Focus Passage-Isaiah 9:1-7

Secondary Passage-Philippians 4:4-9

Synopsis—Even in the darkness, we rejoice because God has promised us a light. As the prophet says, there will be no more gloom for those in distress, for a great light is coming. Joy begins before fulfillment, we find it in the certainty of God's promise.


Meridian Care Team

During visitations, some of our covenant partners have stated that they really miss church activities such as Lenten dinners and other meals and gatherings. In an effort to maintain a close church family, we are looking for

volunteers who would be interested in providing transportation for these individuals. Of note, this is not a church sanctioned activity and would be an agreement between the two individuals. The plan would be to provide the shut-ins and those in facilities with a list of people whom they could contact if they would like to arrange transportation. 




FISHBONE:




Congratulations to the 12 kids that completed communion class. These kids worked hard and made a great commitment to the church. We also celebrated our third graders by giving them Bibles of their own.
