<sup>23</sup> *"The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" which means "God with us".* *Matthew 1:23*

Christmas is over—at least the version our culture calls Christmas. Trees come down, gifts are put away, lights disappear, carols fade, and the commercials finally stop. If you're reading this, congratulations—you've made it through another Christmas season.

But here's the good news: Christmas is really just beginning. Every Christmas Eve, I sense a collective sign of relief from the congregation, as if we've finally reached the end of a long and busy season. Yet for Christians, the true meaning of Christmas—*God with us*—is not something that ends on December 25th. Once the noise and distraction of the secular celebration fade, we are invited to focus more deeply on what God has done and what lies ahead.

The child born in a manger is not merely a memory we celebrate once a year. He is the fulfillment of God's promise to dwell among us. Christmas reminds us that God has drawn near, and that those who follow Jesus are called to live as light in a dark world.

Christmas isn't over. God has arrived. This is not a truth to pack away with the decorations, but one to proclaim boldly. The light has pierced the darkness, and the darkness cannot overcome it. As you store away your Christmas décor, consider leaving a manger scene somewhere in your home—a simple, visible reminder of this enduring promise: *"They will call him Immanuel...God with us."* As we step into a new year, we do so with confidence and hope, knowing that Christ has come and God is in our midst.

# SERMON SERIES

## Hebrews Continued

### January 4th

Title – “**Endure in Peace**”

Focus Passage – Hebrews 12:8-17

Secondary Passage – Proverbs 3:11-12

Synopsis – Children need discipline. Sometimes we misinterpret that to mean punishment or abuse. True discipline is rooted in love and it guides the child on to the right path. Part of perseverance is enduring hardships trusting that the Lord is putting us on the right path. In this way we should spur one another on toward peace, striving for holiness and God’s grace.

### January 18th

Title – “**Keep on Loving**”

Focus Passage – Hebrews 13:1-8

Secondary Passage – Malachi 3:6-12

Synopsis – The Lord is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. The rules of the game do not change, we are to love one another, show hospitality, live generously, and remember those who suffer. This is the call of the Christian life and when we live it, the world can witness the kingdom of God.

### January 11th

Title – “**The Mountain of Joy**”

Focus Passage – Hebrews 12:18-29

Secondary Passage – Exodus 19:16-23

Synopsis – In Christ, the limits around the mountain have been removed. This text is a clear comparison between Moses at Mt. Sinai and the people of God as they come to Mt. Zion. Sinai was filled with fear and trembling, but Zion is filled with the choir of angels and those that lived by faith. Come to the mountain of joy.

### January 25th

Title – “**A Sacrifice of Praise**”

Focus Passage – Hebrews 13:9-19

Secondary Passage – Psalm 150

Synopsis – Instead of bringing a sacrificed animal for our sins, we now bring a sacrifice of praise. Jesus has broken the bonds of the old covenant. Instead of looking at the holy city, Jerusalem, we should be looking forward to the new city that is to come, that is the kingdom of God. The world will try to blow us off track, but he is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow.



As we approach the end of our study time in the book of Habakkuk, I am filled with gratitude. We’ve really experienced growth as we wrestled with hard topics. I hope this holiday break has been a time of rest and renewal for you and your families. This month our meeting days are:

## Two Services – Starting February 15<sup>th</sup>!

As many of you are aware, our church has reached an important milestone. In response to our growing congregation—and increasing parking and seating constraints—Session has approved a move to two Sunday morning worship services beginning **February 15**.

Our Discernment and Strategy Team has been working diligently to ensure this transition is as smooth as possible. We are grateful for their thoughtful planning and care throughout this process.

### What's Changing—and What's Not

Our worship style and overall structure will remain the same. Pastor Steve, or whoever is preaching, will preach that same message in both services. The primary change is **service times**:

- **8:45 AM Service**
  - Choir-led worship
  - Junior Church available
- **11:00 AM Service**
  - Slightly modified structure and flow
  - No choir
  - Currently no Junior Church but, will still have a Children's Sermon

The nursery will be open throughout the morning for both services. To continue offering this vital ministry, we are in **urgent need of additional nursery volunteers**. If you are willing to serve, please contact the church office.

### Sunday School and Fellowship

Sunday School for all ages will be offered from **10:00–10:45 AM**. During this time, a fellowship hour will also be available in the gathering space for those who prefer conversation and connection over classes.

On every fifth Sunday, there will be no Sunday School. Instead, the entire church is invited to an all-church brunch in McCaslin Hall.

### Looking Ahead

At this time, we plan to return to one worship service for the summer, beginning Memorial Day weekend.
